TUE 24OCT23 La Goulette (Tunis), Tunisia 7:00am 5:00pm



Greetings to all my friends back home,



Today's city surrounds 2 huge, surviving ancient monuments: graceful Luxor Temple and Karnak Temple, a mile north. The royal tombs of the Valley of the Kings and the Valley of the Queens are on the river's west bank.












I'M ON MY WAY HOME NOW!


Happy Holidays Everyone,
